GRAND KNIGHT'S COLUMN

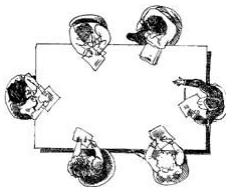


Summer time has arrived and the weather is beautiful! Be sure to take a break from mowing the lawn to relax and enjoy the sunshine and your favorite beverage.

The 122nd Supreme Convention will be held in Dallas, Aug. 3-5. An expected 2,500 Knights and families from throughout the Order will converge on the Hyatt Regency Dallas to participate in the meeting, attend convention Masses and other spiritual events, and socialize with one another. The 2005 Supreme will be held in Chicago IL. August 2-4. The third Eucharistic Congress will take place immediately following the 2005 annual meeting in Chicago and cap the Year of the Eucharist proclaimed by Pope John Paul II.
