### GRAND KNIGHT'S COLUMN

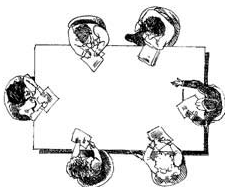

## DIOCESAN MEETING

The diocesan meeting was attended by Jim Barnett, Dan Barrington, Leon Janowski, and John Murphy on September 11th at St. Joseph School in Green Bay..

Charity Raffle - At the Diocesan Meeting, we received a check in the amount of \$3,280 from the Charity Raffle for our Charity account.

Tootsie Roll Campaign - Also at the Diocesan Meeting, we received a check for the Tootsie Roll Campaign written out to B.A.R.C. in the amount of \$961.97 and a check written out to Ministry Persons with Disabilities in the amount of \$961.96. In total, Councils in the Diocese of Green Bay raised \$156,000 and 75% of that amount stays local. This is up from \$151,000 in 2003. The state council received \$400,000 in charity requests, but only had \$139,000 to distribute. Everyone that helped with the Tootsie Roll Campaign definitely contributed to a great cause, but there is still a lot of need out there.

Membership - The KC membership in the state is 39,205 members. This is the 4th year in a row with a net decrease. Our council is doing pretty well on membership, but the state as a whole is struggling. If there is a man you think would be a good knight... just ask him.
