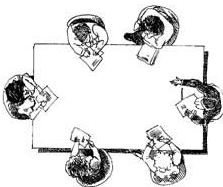
GRAND KNIGHT'S COLUMN

Delegates to the 123rd annual Supreme Council meeting adopted resolutions declaring that the Order "will never consider Roe v. Wade to be settled constitutional law," and urged the U.S. Senate to "conduct prompt, fair and expeditious hearings on the nomination of John G. Roberts to the United States Supreme Court." Why Join the Knights of Columbus?

Recruiting new members is the responsibility of each Knight. Please remember to inform those you feel are worthy candidates for the knights of the fulfillment that comes from being a part of the knights.

Knights are Catholic men, 18 years of age and older, who are committed to making their community a better place, while supporting their Church. Being a Knight is more than camaraderie; it is being involved with your community; it is supporting your local Catholic Church, while enhancing your own faith; it is about protecting and enhancing your family life.

Types of Membership

Catholic men 18 years of age or older who join the Knights belong to a council, or local unit. Many 18 to 22 year olds first join the Knights of Columbus in a college council.

Members who have been in the Knights for one year and have attained Third Degree membership are eligible to join the Fourth Degree Knights.

The Knights of Columbus also sponsors the Columbian Squires, a service and leadership training organization for Catholic young men ages 10 to 18 years old.
