GRAND KNIGHT'S COLUMN



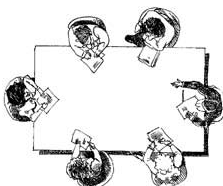
The weather is getting warmer, so spring must be on its way. It sure has been nice seeing the sun shining for a change.

Thanks to everyone that helped with the March Booyah. A special thanks needs to go to Tom Gauthier and Randy Barrett for making our own trailer mounted kettles

become a reality. They're not only done but they are special. Two of the finest kettles in the land mounted on a trailer that is a Cadillac amongst trailers. The trailer and Kettles attracted as much attention as the Booyah as well they should have. With the trailer mounted kettles we now have the capacity to cook more Booyah in a much safer and more efficient manner then before.

There must be some magic with the the new kettles because we smashed our old record for cash profit by more than 8%. The total cash profit was \$719.30. In addition we donated 22 gals. of Booyah and 1 pie with a value of \$356. Not a bad weekend's work. We are now almost \$200 ahead of where we were after the 3rd Booyah last year.

That is a great accomplishment when you consider that 2 of our highest profit Booyahs in the last 5 years took place in those first three Booyahs last year and our second Booyah this past November was the lowest profit Booyah in the last 5 years. Next month should be another great one and I'm already looking forward to it.
