GRAND KNIGHT'S COLUMN



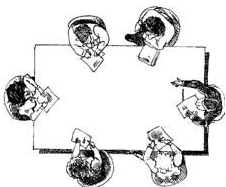

How to Enhance Your Coverage

There's a simple-and painless-way to increase the amount of your permanent life insurance coverage. How? Simply use your policy dividend to purchase paid-up additions. When you choose this dividend option, your dividend becomes a single premium that purchases additional insurance on your life. How much depends on your age: A \$500 dividend will buy more insurance if you're 25 than if you're 50.

Over time, the increase in your policy's face value-the amount you're insured for-can increase substantially. What's more, your paid-up additions build cash value and are eligible to receive dividends, beyond that of the base policy and with no current tax liability. (Remember the dividends are not guaranteed.)

Regardless of your current health, paid-up additions are purchased at a standard rate. An additional note -at any time while your policy is in effect, you can change the way your dividends are paid to you. The other dividend options are:

* Leaving them on deposit to accumulate interest.

* Taking them as a cash payment.

* Applying dividend to pay all or part of your premium.

One -A-Week Club

The American Red Cross sponsors the One-A-Week club where they encourage businesses or organizations to collect at least 52 pints of blood over the course of one year. Like the Red Cross, the Knights of Columbus prides itself on both community involvement and taking care of basic human needs. Many members of the Knights have been "rolling up their sleeves" for years now. To help out on various community projects with hands on activities, or to just lie back with their sleeves up while donating blood to help someone they will never meet. Both organizations have a proud and rich tradition, of helping out where help is needed.

The Knights have been donating blood individually for years just because it was the right thing to do. Then about 5 years ago the One-A-Week club for the Knights was reactivated and a new focus was put forth encouraging all of the members and their families who could donate to do so. With a little coaxing, we have certainly accomplished a lot. In 2004 we donated a total of 150 pints of blood which was our highest single year total. That effort got us "Gold Category" recognition for a top club without an on-site blood drive. This past year we managed to break the 100 mark again, this time with 115 pints. Even though our donations were down from the previous year we are still one of the major organizations that contribute consistently to this worthwhile cause. We missed the gold category by only 24 and the silver award by only 2.

I would like to pass on the many "Thanks" that I have received on your behalf for all of the generosity and good that has come from your many donations. Please, please keep up the good work.
