### GRAND KNIGHT'S COLUMN

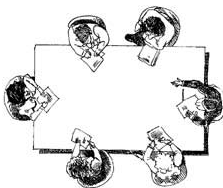


It's hard to believe this is my final newsletter as Grand Knight. The time has really flown by. It has been a wonderful opportunity to work with all of you for so many wonderful charities.

**SPECIAL OLYMPICS**



The first year of the State program has had mixed results. There are 69 councils taking part in the cell phone recycling, but only 23 councils have sent in phones for recycling, over 1,100 phones. This program will continue for many more years. If all councils became active and recycle an average of 50 phones per year, we would be well over 14,000 phones a year. And if they only averaged \$3.00 per phone, it would realize over \$42,000 for Wisconsin Special Olympics. Just think if they averaged \$5.00 or maybe \$10.00 how great that would be. That could help many hundreds or thousands of new athletes to take part in sporting activities.

Let us all make 2006-2007 a great year for Special Olympics. Remember that with the Grace of God, we can help our fellow man.
