## GRAND KNIGHTS COLUMN



It has been a very light winter so far, just a few flurries here and there. From an activity standpoint, January was much like the weather, brief flurries of activity such as the Knowledge and Free Throw Contests. Participation by the students has been waning over the last couple of years and I'm not sure why.

Lent starts later this month. I remember in grade school that the good Sisters wanted to help us understand that the approach to Lent didn't have to be negative as in "I had to give up candy for Lent". Rather, like the renewal of spring, Lent affords us with an opportunity to reflect and experience a renewal of our faith and our commitment to the tenets of knighthood. In preparing for the annual audit, I reviewed the figures from calendar year 2005. Our actions included 1128 visits to the sick, 518 visits to the bereaved, 6959 hours volunteered to the Church and 6204 hours of volunteer work in the community.
