There were a few winners from our area but none from our Council. We received a report of the recipients of the Charity Fund grants from the last year ranging from a six-month old child in need of open heart surgery, a father of four who is disabled to a 61 yr old man who is paralyzed. This is a very important event in which we take part every year and provides much needed assistance to our friends and neighbors in need.
